Entries will be divided into seven categories, each showing youngest to oldest: Carcass Steers will be on display. On-Hoof Steers will show first, followed by Bred-and-Owned Cow-Calf Pairs then by Owned Cow-Calf Pairs, then Bred-and-Owned Bulls and Bred-and-Owned Heifers, with Owned Heifers showing last. No more than 15 head will be shown in one class. The animals will be led into the show area in order of catalog entry number within each category.

Entries 1 through 42 are in the Carcass Steer Category.

Entries 43 through 149 are in the Steer Category.

Entries 150 through 175 are in the Bred-and-Owned Cow-Calf Category.

Entries 176 through 245 are in the Owned Cow-Calf Category.

Entries 246 through 389 are in the Bred-and-Owned Bull Category.

Entries 390 through 787 are in the Bred-and-Owned Heifer Category.

Entries 788 through 1771 are in the Owned Heifer Category.

Twenty-five percent (25%) will be added to the premiums for entries enrolled in the Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) program. To be eligible for the twenty-five percent (25%) added premium, the animal exhibited must meet the following requirements by entry deadline:

- a. The animal being exhibited must have weights processed through AHIR.
- b. The dam of the animal being exhibited must have weight information processed on previous calves, or if the animal being exhibited is her first calf, the dams own performance information must have been processed through the AHIR program.

Entry numbers which have an asterisk are eligible for the added AHIR premium.
