The 2018 NJAS marks the 50th anniversary for the event. For half a century, Angus junior members and their families have traveled the country with their prized Angus cattle to showcase their showmanship and leadership skills. Every year, new activities are added to the program in hopes of giving the juniors a better experience. This year's new events include the revamped poster contest and auctioneering contest.


