Dear Junior Angus Exhibitor:

The Guardians of the Plains will be gathered in Grand Island, NE on July 1-8. The American Angus Association and National Junior Angus Board of Directors are your hosts this year, and the 2023 National Junior Angus Show is set to be one of the biggest shows yet! We invite you to join us for the "Best 8 Days in July"!

This letter is to confirm that your entry for the 2023 NJAS has been received and is eligible. In this letter and the enclosures, you will find general information about the show, an updated show schedule, a map with directions to Nebraska State Fairgrounds in Grand Island, NE. <u>Please read this letter and all of the enclosures in their entirety.</u>

<u>Directions</u>: Please follow the directions and map provided in this mailing. All traffic will be directed to enter through Gate 6 off of Fonner Park Road on the NORTH end of the fairgrounds.



Arrival: Out of state cattle should <u>not arrive before 6 p.m. on Saturday evening</u>, <u>July 1. You will not be allowed to setup in barns until 6 p.m.</u> Any out of state travelers arriving prior to Sunday morning will be directed to tie outs. No out of state cattle permitted into the barns until Sunday 6 a.m.

<u>Trailer Parking</u>: There will be designated trailer parking on the west end of the sheep barn. All trailers will be required to park in this area after they have unloaded.

<u>Semitrailer Entrance</u>: Semis need to proceed to Gate 6 and will be directed to the unloading chute, then proceed to designated trailer parking for parking.

<u>Tie-outs:</u> Tie-outs will be available on Saturday, July 1. PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE BEFORE 6 P.M. Tie-outs will be assigned by state, with bedding provided. If cattle arrive on Saturday evening, they must remain in tie-out. NO generators are allowed in tie-outs. No straw will be used in tie-outs.

<u>Barns</u>: The panels in the barns are wood/metal. You <u>cannot</u> paint these panels. We will stall in the Sheep, Cattle and Swine Barns. No aisle fans are allowed.

<u>Stalling:</u> The stalls will be designated by state as a total block. A stalling map will be provided to your advisors prior to the arrival date. You will need to contact your state junior advisors who will coordinate this for your state. A stalling map will be given to you at the welcoming station when entering the fairgrounds.

Parking: No parking will be allowed around the barns due to safety precautions. Please park in designated parking lots. See map indicating public parking areas. Vehicles parked around the barns will be towed.

<u>Portacoolers and Generators:</u> NOT ALLOWED! Please do not bring them, you will be required to remove them.

<u>Golf Carts/Gators/ATVs:</u> NOT ALLOWED! Please do not bring them, you will be required to remove them.

<u>Carcass Steers</u>: All carcass steers will check-in Sunday evening. Exhibitors will be informed of the designated load out time and area prior to check-in.

Bedding: The bedding will be placed in the barns prior to your arrival. The bedding is bark and supplied by the fairgrounds. Exhibitors will be allowed to add their own if they would like. No straw in barn or tie-outs.

<u>Feed:</u> Feed and hay will be available for purchase on the fairgrounds. It is strongly encouraged to pre-order as the on-site store will have limited hours of operation. Please view the flyer included for details on the store hours and pre-order information.

Health Papers: Health Requirements are enclosed for the show, for your review. For any questions, please contact the Nebraska Department of Agriculture at 402-471-2341. Health papers will be checked during check-in.

<u>Code of Conduct</u>: Each NJAS exhibitor will need to have a NJAA Code of Conduct on file prior to the individual's first NJAA-sponsored show or conference. Code of Conducts can be found on the NJAA website and can be submitted to the Events and Junior Activities Department via fax, email to events@angus.org or mailed.

<u>Hotel</u>: If you have not made reservations, you can find the American Angus Association room blocks on the NJAA website.

<u>Camping:</u> The RV Park rate is \$35 per night. All RV spaces come with water, sewer, and electric. Each individual will need to reserve a spot at the RV Park. For more camping information, visit https://fonnerpark.com/newpage

<u>Meals</u>: Meals will be limited at the NJAS. However, food vendors will be available on the fairgrounds for purchase.

Golf Tournament: The Angus Foundation Golf Tournament is Tuesday, July 4 and will be held at Indianhead Golf Club in Grand Island, NE. Space is still available so call Kris Sticken at (816) 383-5100 today to sign up to play or to be a sponsor.

<u>Dress Code</u>: The American Angus Association Board of Directors and the NJAA Board have instituted dress code requirements for both the cattle show and social activities. Exhibitors must show in a collared shirt. Please plan accordingly.

<u>Dogs</u>: Dogs are strongly discouraged and <u>will not be allowed in the make-up or show ring areas.</u> Exhibitor complaints may cause removal of dog from the grounds.

<u>Streaming Video</u>: Your family and friends who are not able to attend the NJAS will be able to watch the show via streaming video (high speed internet connection recommended) through Walton Webcasting.

<u>Contests:</u> The process of signing up for contests has been modified. Participants can sign up for contests using AAA login online contest portal all the way through Sunday, July 2nd at 7:30 PM. These contests include:

- Prepared Public Speaking (Please bring a title page and outline to contest check-in)
- Poster Contest (Please bring your poster to contest check-in to turn in)
- Extemporaneous Public Speaking
- Judging Contest
- Quiz Bowl Written Test
- Skill-a-thon
- Auctioneering (Award includes a cash prize of \$333 for the top auctioneer in each division)

NJAS 23 Tshirts: If you pre-ordered a NJAS 2023 edition t-shirt, you can pick those up at the Angus Brand store in the Pinnacle Bank Expo Center after Monday, July 3rd at Noon. If you missed the opportunity, limited shirts will be available for purchase.

Community Service Project: Angus Impact is the official community service program of the National Junior Angus Association. The goal is to encourage NJAA members and State Association's to make their mark, leave their impact and be the change through acts of service. Show Supply: Sullivan Supply is the exclusive vendor at the National Junior Angus Show and will be available all week to purchase any show supplies you may need. You can find them outside across from the show office towards tie-outs.

Reminder: Don't forget to bring your registration certificate, and before you leave home, make sure your animals tattoo is legible and corresponds with the registration paper. We recommend you bring your hard copy registration paper. However, if you choose to use a copy or the Angus mobile application, you will be required to bring your animal to check-in for the tattoo to be read if not ID Verified.

Health Requirements for Cattle Exhibited in Nebraska

If you have any questions regarding health regulations please call the following: 402-471-2351 - NE Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Protection

***Please do not call the American Angus Association with Health Regulation questions, we do not have those answers and will forward you onto the NE Department of Agriculture.

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

 All cattle entering Fonner Park must be accompanied by a current CVI and shall be identified on the CVI. CVIs must list the Fonner Park as consignee.

Each CVI must:

- Be issued by an accredited licensed veterinarian.
- Show name and address of owner or exhibitor.
- Show all required tests and/or vaccinations.
- CVIs must be issued within 30 days of the exhibition

General Health Requirements for All Animals

- Representatives of the State Veterinarian's Office will be in attendance to verify CVIs.
- Under no circumstances may animals under quarantine be exhibited.
- Only animals not showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases will be allowed to show.
- Animals that have active ringworm, lesions, visible warts, dermatitis, or abscesses will not be allowed entry into Fonner Park for exhibition.
- The inspecting veterinarian may judge the ringworm to be inactive if the lesion is not encrusted and hair has begun re-growth in the area and is so stated on the CVI.
- All animals entering Fonner Park will be subject to examination by a veterinarian or a representative of the State Veterinarian's Office upon arrival or during the show. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases may be immediately withdrawn from the show and held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until properly released to return to owner's premises following treatment.
- Animals with warts that are visible by a hands-on inspection will not be allowed to remain on the premises.
- Any animals that are sold or staying in Nebraska after exhibition must meet Nebraska import requirements.
- If Vesicular Stomatitis Virus (VSV) is detected in Nebraska or any other state, additional requirements may be put in place.

Nebraska Origin Beef Cattle

- 1. Tuberculosis: no test required to exhibit. Must be from a herd not under quarantine.
- 2. Brucellosis: no test required to exhibit. Must be from a herd not under quarantine.
- Trichomoniasis: there are no Trichomoniasis testing requirements for animals originating from within Nebraska

Out-of-State Origin Beef Cattle

Tuberculosis:

- 1. Accredited Free States or Zones:
 - a. Beef cattle no testing required.
- 2. Modified Accredited Advanced State or Zone:
 - a. Beef cattle no testing required.
- 3. Modified Accredited State or Zone:
 - a. Beef cattle which originate from a herd not under quarantine for tuberculosis shall:
 - b. Originate from a TB accredited herd, with the accredited herd number listed on the CVI.
 - c. Have obtained a permit for entry.
 - d. Be individually identified with the identification listed on the CVI.
 - e. Have tested negative to an official tuberculin test within 60 days prior to entry, or originate from a herd which has tested negative to an official whole herd tuberculin test within three hundred sixty-five (365) days prior to entry, and shall:
 - i. Have obtained a permit for entry.
 - ii. Be individually identified with the identification listed on the CVI.
 - Have tested negative to an official tuberculin test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

Brucellosis:


- 1. Class-Free states:
 - a. no test required. Must be from a herd not under quarantine.

2. Class A states:

- Steers and market-class heifers no testing required.
- **b.** Bulls and breeding females less than 18 months of age no testing required.
- c. Bulls and breeding females, over 18 months of age, must conform to one of the following:
 - i. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd and the certification number recorded on the CVI; or tested and classified negative for brucellosis not more than 30 days prior to entry.

Trichomoniasis:

- Cattle entering Nebraska for exhibition purposes are exempt for the requirements of the "Nebraska Amended Trichomoniasis Import Order".
- Animals remaining in Nebraska for any reason, other than slaughter, after exhibition, shall meet the requirements of the Order.

Please follow the below instructions for unloading trailers.

Nebraska State Fairgrounds 501 E Fonner Park Rd Grand Island, NE 68801

All trailers and semis will follow the same directions below.

- 1) At this point, you will be assigned a barn door and line according to where your state is stalled.
- 2) This is the staging area. We will hold you here until there is an opening near your barn.
 - -To help with flow and congestion, please unload everything from your trailer to your stalls. Do NOT start setting up your stall area until your trailer has been moved into trailer parking.
- 3) Once your trailer is unloaded, follow the map to trailer parking. Parking attendants will be on site directing traffic.

Contests, exhibitor check-in and tattoo check will happen in the Five Points Bank Arena at the following times:

Sunday (7/2) from 4:00 - 7:30 PM

*Contest sign up deadline is 7:30 PM

Monday (7/3) from 7:30 - 8:30 AM

Exhibitors must check-in during these times to be eligible to show. Exhibitors must bring their registration papers and contest information to check-in.



If tattoos have not been verified or registration papers have not been stamped, cattle will not be checked in until stamped. Please take cattle and registration papers to Regional Managers in make-up area Five Points Bank Arena. This needs to be completed by check-in deadline.
