Dear Junior Angus Exhibitor:

The Biggest Show on Dirt will be held in Kansas City, MO on July 2-9. Powered by Kansas, the 2022 National Junior Angus Show is set to be one of the biggest shows yet! We invite you to join us for the “Best 7 Days in July”!

This letter is to confirm that your entry for the 2022 NJAS has been received and is eligible. In this letter and the enclosures, you will find general information about the show, an updated show schedule, a map with directions to American Royal Complex in Kansas City, MO. **Please read this letter and all of the enclosures in their entirety.**

Directions: Please follow the directions and map provided in this mailing. All traffic will be directed to enter through the gate off of State Line Road. Follow signage at Genessee (as you approach Hy-Vee Arena). Turn west onto State Line Road from Genessee. State Line Road immediately curves to the south.

Arrival: Out of state cattle should not **arrive before 6 p.m. on Saturday evening, July 2nd. You will not be allowed to setup in barns until 6 p.m.** Any out of state travelers arriving prior to Sunday morning will be directed to tie outs. No out of state cattle permitted into the barns until Sunday 6 a.m.

Trailer Parking: There will be designated trailer parking in the Liberty Lot, with over flow parking in Monahan 1 and 2 and Crane Lots. See indicated trailer parking lots on the map. All trailers will be required to park in this area after they have unloaded.

Semitrailer Entrance: Semis need to enter through the same entrance gate off of State Line Rd. They will then be directed to unloading area and then proceed to designated trailer parking for parking.

Tie-outs: Tie-outs will be available on Saturday, July 2. **PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE BEFORE 6 P.M.** Tie-outs will be assigned by state, with bedding provided. If cattle arrive on Friday evening, they must remain in tie-out. NO generators are allowed in tie-outs. No straw will be used in tie-outs.

Barns: The panels in the barns are wood/metal. You **cannot** paint these panels. We will stall in the Lower Ex, Upper Ex, and Governor’s. No aisle fans are allowed.

Stalling: The stalls will be designated by state as a total block. A stalling map will be provided to your advisors prior to the arrival date. You will need to contact your state junior advisors who will coordinate this for your state. A stalling map will be given to you at the welcoming station when entering the fairgrounds.

Parking: No parking will be allowed around the barns due to safety precautions. Please park in designated parking lots. See map indicating public parking areas.

Portacoolers and Generators: **NOT ALLOWED!** Please do not bring them, you will be required to remove them.

Golf Carts/Gators/ATVs: **NOT ALLOWED!** Please do not bring them, you will be required to remove them.

Carcass Steers: All carcass steers will check-in Monday afternoon. Exhibitors will be informed of the designated load out time and area prior to check-in.

Bedding: The bedding will be placed in the barns prior to your arrival. The bedding is bark and supplied by the fairgrounds. Exhibitors will be allowed to add their own if they would like. No straw in barn or tie-outs.

Feed: Feed and hay will be available for purchase on the grounds. It is strongly encouraged to pre-order as the on-site store will have limited hours of operations. Pre-orders can be placed by completing the online form. Visit the www.njas.info for the completed form.

Health Papers: Health Requirements are enclosed for the show, for your review. For any questions, please contact the Missouri Department of Agriculture at 573-751-3377. Health papers will be checked during check-in. Please bring **TWO** copies with you. One for the vet to keep and one for the exhibitor.

Code of Conduct: Each NJAS exhibitor will need to have a NJAA Code of Conduct on file prior to the individual's first NJAA-sponsored show or conference. Code of Conducts can be found on the NJAA website and can be submitted to the Events and Junior Activities Department via fax, email to events@angus.org or mailed.

Hotel: If you have not made reservations, you can find the American Angus Association room blocks on the NJAA website.

Camping: There is no camping available on the grounds. Off site camping is available at Worlds of Fun Village.

Meals: Meals will be limited at the NJAS. However, food vendors will be available on the fairgrounds for purchase. See schedule for meals sponsored by the American Angus Association.

Golf Tournament: The Angus Foundation Golf Tournament is Tuesday, July 5 and will be held at Shiloh Springs Golf Course in Platte City, MO. Space is still available so call Kris Sticken at (816) 383-5100 today to sign up to play or to be a sponsor.

Dress Code: The American Angus Association Board of Directors and the NJAA Board have instituted dress code requirements for both the cattle show and social activities. Please plan accordingly.

Dogs: Dogs are strongly discouraged and will not be allowed in the make-up or show ring areas. Exhibitor complaints may cause removal of dog from the grounds. Please notify everyone who might be traveling with you to the show of this rule.

Streaming Video: Your family and friends who are not able to attend the NJAS will be able to watch the show via streaming video (high speed internet connection recommended) by logging onto: www.njas.info

Contests: The process of signing up for contests has been modified. Starting with the 2022 NJAS, participants can sign up for contests online all the way through Monday, July 4th at 12:00 PM. All contests will be signed up using AAA login contest portal. These contests include:

- Prepared Public Speaking (Please bring a title page and outline to contest check-in)
- Poster Contest (Please bring your poster to contest check-in to turn in)
- Extemporaneous Public Speaking
- Judging Contest
- Quiz Bowl Written Test
- Skill-a-thon
- Auctioneering (Award includes a cash prize of \$333 for the top auctioneer in each division)

See your state advisor to sign up for a Quiz Bowl team, Team Fitting and Team Sales. AMP will be available for sign up at contest check-in.

Community Service Project: Angus Impact is the official community service program of the National Junior Angus Association. The goal is to encourage NJAA members and State Association's to make their mark, leave their impact and be the change through acts of service. Any items brought to NJAS will benefit a local organization to Kansas City, Giving the Basics. If participants choose to bring items, we ask you to turn them in during check-in on Sunday July 3rd and Monday July 4th. Please see the flyer enclosed for more details on what you can bring.

Flat Andy: Flat Andy is back for the tenth year, and we hope you'll join in. Andy is a spin-off of the Flat Stanley activity, popular in grade schools around the country. Flat Andy is included in your confirmation package to cut out, color and bring with you to Kansas City. Submit your photos to win \$50 credit towards The Angus Brand merchandise store. To submit a photo follow these steps: Text @njasfa to 81010 to sign up for the Remind app (you do not have to download the app). After receiving a confirmation text, reply with your photos you would like to enter. Be sure to include your NAME and STATE.

BAND App: This year we are implementing a reminder group service for up-to-date information on all things NJAS. To subscribe, scan the QR code below. You'll be asked to download the BAND App to join the 2022 NJAS group. Make sure to allow notifications to receive alerts on any postings.



Reminder: Don't forget to bring your registration certificate, and before you leave home, make sure your animals tattoo is legible and corresponds with the registration paper. We recommend you bring your hard copy registration paper, however if you choose to use a copy or the Angus mobile application, you will be required to bring your animal to check-in for the tattoo to be read.

Show Supply: Sullivan Supply is the exclusive vendor at the National Junior Angus Show and will be available all week to purchase any show supplies you may need. You can find them inside Hale Arena.

2022 NJAS HEALTH REGULATIONS

Please do not call the American Angus Association with Health Regulation questions, we do not have those answers and will forward you onto the MO Department of Agriculture.

The following listed minimal health and testing requirements on livestock are for exhibition only and do not qualify livestock to be sold or moved to a new owner or destination. Complete set of regulations at: <https://s1.sos.mo.gov/cmsimages/adrules/csr/current/2csr/2c30-2.pdf>

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection

- All animals exhibited must have a current health certificate/certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) issued within thirty (30) days before the show. The certificate must be issued from the state of origin by a licensed accredited veterinarian. For breeding cattle, animals can be identified with registration tattoo with papers or official ID tag.
- **Please bring **TWO** copies with you. One for the vet to keep and one for the exhibitor.**
- *The animals must be individually identified stating that they have been examined and are free of contagious and infectious disease.*
- Animals with active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair or warts easily visible without close examination will not be permitted to exhibit and shall be subject to isolation or expulsion depending upon the nature and seriousness of the disease.

Brucellosis:

- Brucellosis free states: Breeding cattle may enter without a Brucellosis test.
- Brucellosis Class A states: All test-eligible animals must be tested and negative within thirty (30) days prior to entry except:
 - a. Cattle from a certified brucellosis-free herd. The certified herd number and the date of the last test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection
 - b. Steers. No brucellosis test required but must be individually identified and listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and state they are free from warts and ringworm as well as infections, contagious, and communicable disease.

Tuberculosis: all classes of beef cattle (including exotic bovids and bison), two (2) months of age and older, entering Missouri for exhibition must meet the following requirements:

- Tuberculosis free state: All beef cattle two (2) months of age and older may enter without additional testing requirements or entry permit.
- Tuberculosis less than free status states must meet the following requirements.
 - a. Must obtain an entry permit.
 - b. Must have a negative tuberculosis test within sixty (60) days of shipment.
 - c. Move from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd
 - d. Or move directly from a herd of origin that has had one (1) complete negative herd test within one (1) year

Entry permit is requested for any cattle entering from a Designated Surveillance Area (DSA) for Brucellosis. Call (573) 751-3377 after Brucellosis testing and health paper are complete for entry permit.

Please follow the below instructions for unloading trailers.

**American Royal Complex

Kansas City, MO 64102**

Trailers and semis will enter through the gate off of State Line Road. Follow signage at Genessee (as you approach Hy-Vee Arena). Turn west onto State Line Road from Genessee. State Line Road immediately curves to the south.

- 1) Upon entering the fairgrounds, trailers be greeted upon arrival. Here Welcome Packets will be handed out.**
- 2) At this point, you will be assigned a barn door entry according to where your state is stalled. Here you will receive a stalling map.**
- 3) To help with flow and congestion, please unload everything from your trailer to your stalls. Do NOT start setting up your stall area until your trailer has been moved into trailer parking.**
- 4) Once your trailer is unloaded, follow the map to trailer parking in the Liberty Lot. Parking attendants will be on site directing traffic. Overflow trailer parking will be made available if necessary.**
 - If unloading at doors 3-7, exit on the northeast side of Hale Arena.**
 - If unloading at doors 12-17, exit on the northwest side of the Governor's Building.**

Contests, exhibitor check-in and tattoo check will happen in Hale Arena at the following times:

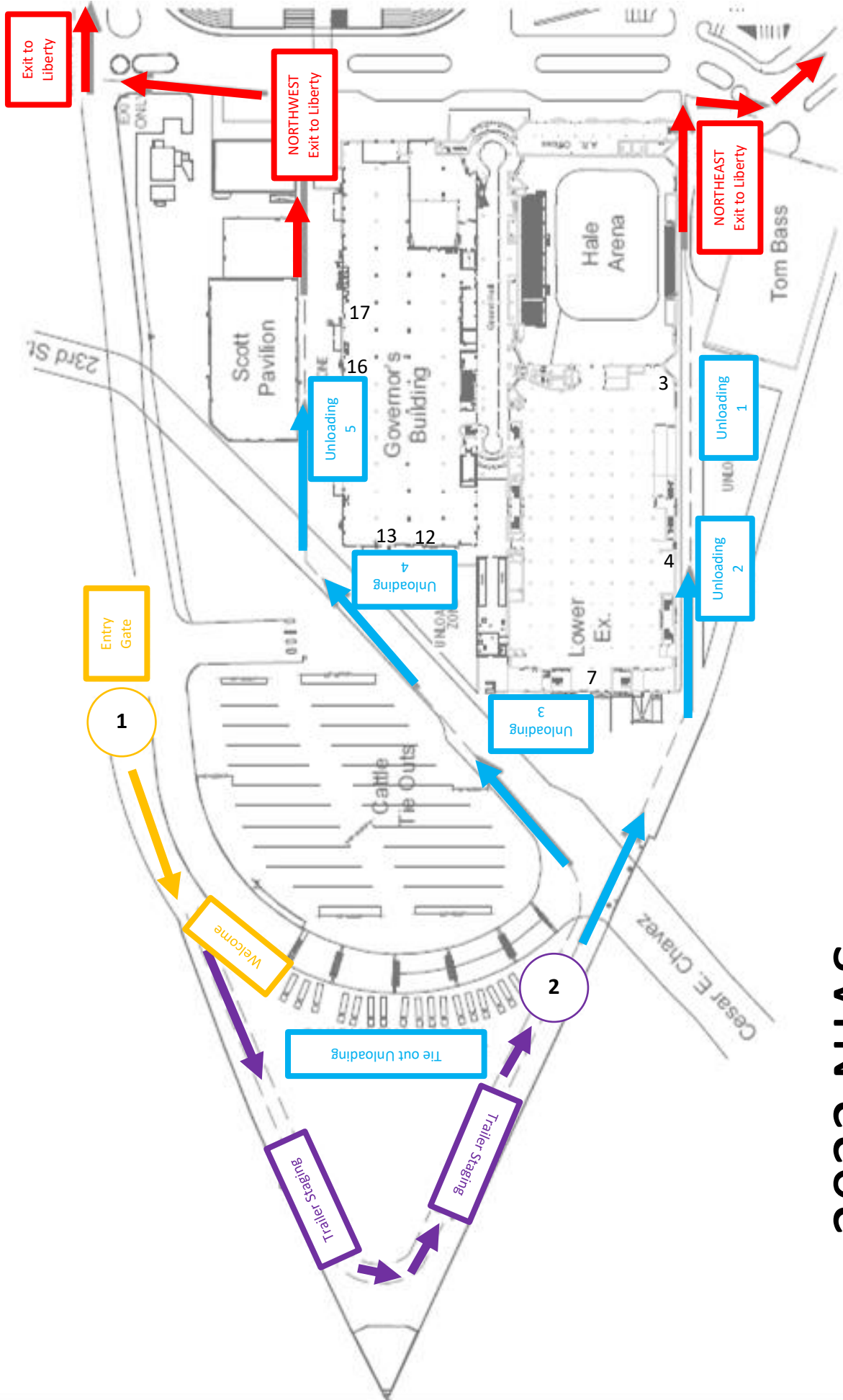
Sunday (7/3) from 1:00 PM-5:00 PM

Exhibitors must check-in during these times to be eligible to show. Exhibitors must bring their registration papers and contest information to check-in.



If tattoos have not been verified or registration papers have not been stamped, cattle will not be checked in until stamped. Please take cattle and registration papers to Regional Managers in make-up area Hale Arena. This needs to be completed by check-in deadline.

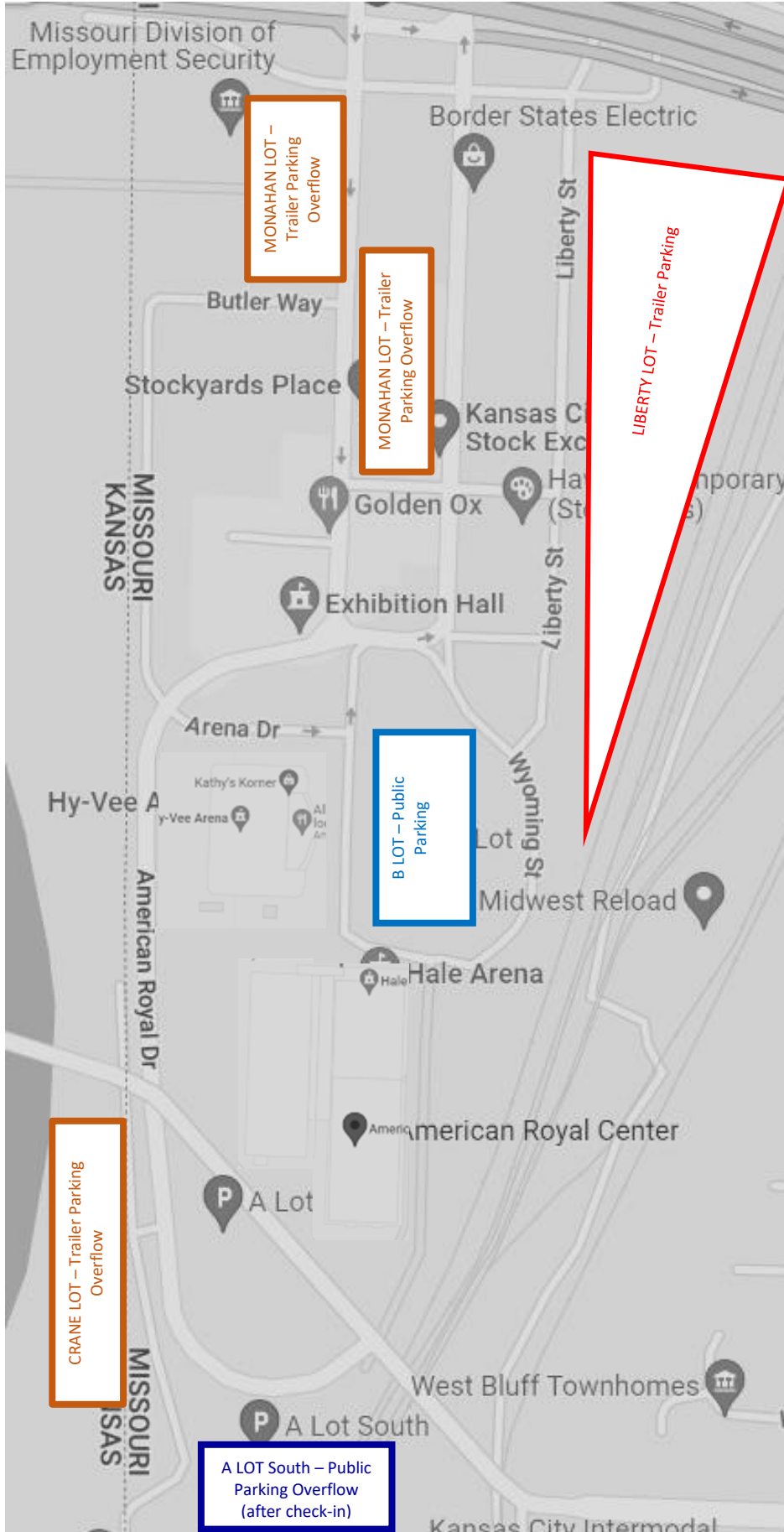

SHOW Dress Code

All junior exhibitors must follow the NJAA Dress Code:

- Junior Angus exhibitors are required to wear tucked-in, collared shirts while in the show ring.

Annual Meeting Dress Code

All candidates and delegates must follow the NJAA Dress Code:

- Shorts and skirts must be fingertip length. (Below the end of your fingertips when standing up with your arms held down to your side.)
- No backless shirts or dresses, this includes halter or tube tops.
- Straps on shirts or dresses must be at least one inch wide.
- No midriffs exposed.
- No exposed undergarments.
